

What we heard...


- This was a **good jump start** for the concept of stations. I hope that future sessions will delve more deeply into the nuts and bolts of implementing.

Average Likelihood to Recommend





Maybe break it down into multiple sessions focusing on more on each strategy. Provide additional resources





What we heard...


- The resources provided are very **helpful** for how to help with students that are dealing with trauma.

Average Likelihood to Recommend




